

Uptime Institute Spending Survey - Data Center Spending for 2025

DECEMBER 2024

SUMMARY

Two-thirds of enterprise owner/operator respondents to Uptime Institute's Data Center Spending Survey expect an increase in their data center budget for 2025. At the same time, 77% of colocation providers expect an increase in their data center budget for next year.

Among enterprise respondents, power (72%) and IT equipment (67%) are the top areas where they expect to spend more in 2025. For colocation providers, power (79%) and cooling equipment (73%) are the areas where they expect to spend more.

For the second year in a row, the percentage of respondents reporting capital project delays (43%) has declined – a positive sign. Manufacturing/equipment delays remain the number one factor driving cap project delays.

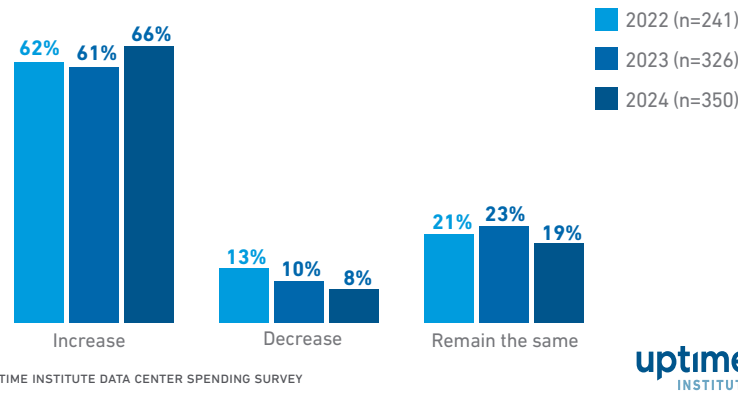
ABOUT THIS SURVEY

Uptime Institute's Data Center Spending Survey was conducted between October 9, 2024 and November 14, 2024 and had a total of 878 data center industry respondents.

This report is based on the results from 453 data center owner/operator respondents.

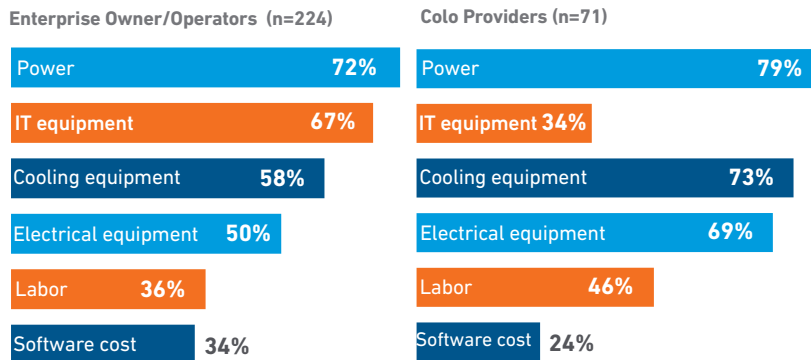
Company budget - enterprise owner/operators

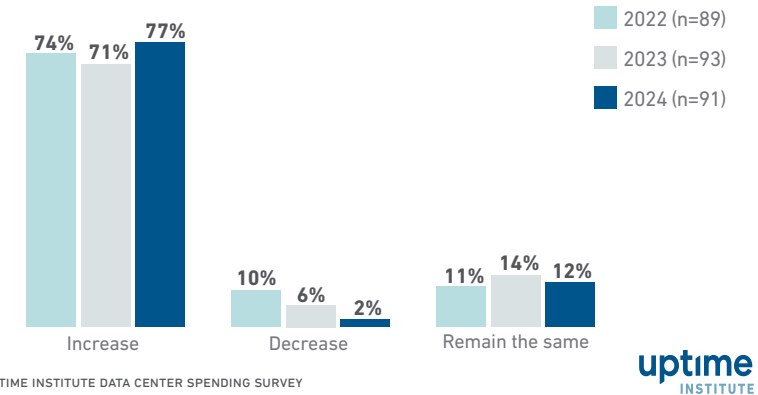
Spending more in 2025 - enterprise owner/ops vs colo providers

III. Thinking about your organization's data centers, which of the following will you be spending more on in 2025 compared to the current year? Choose all that apply.



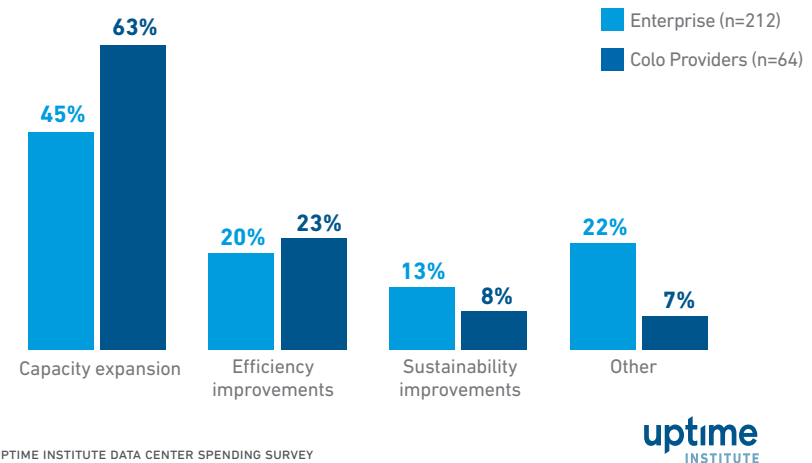
Company budget - colo providers

Biggest overall driver of planned spending increase

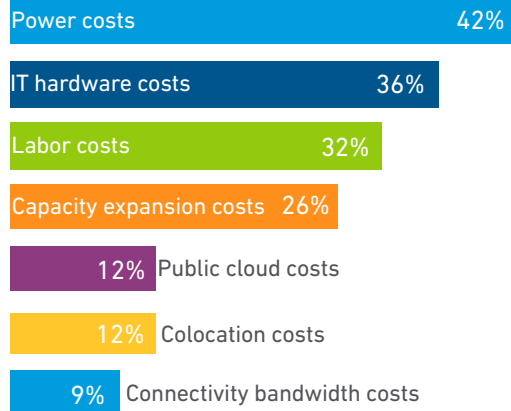
IV. Which of these is the biggest overall driver of your planned spending increase?



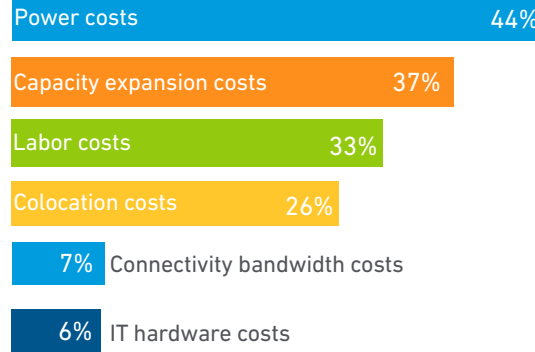
Data center expenses - greatest increases

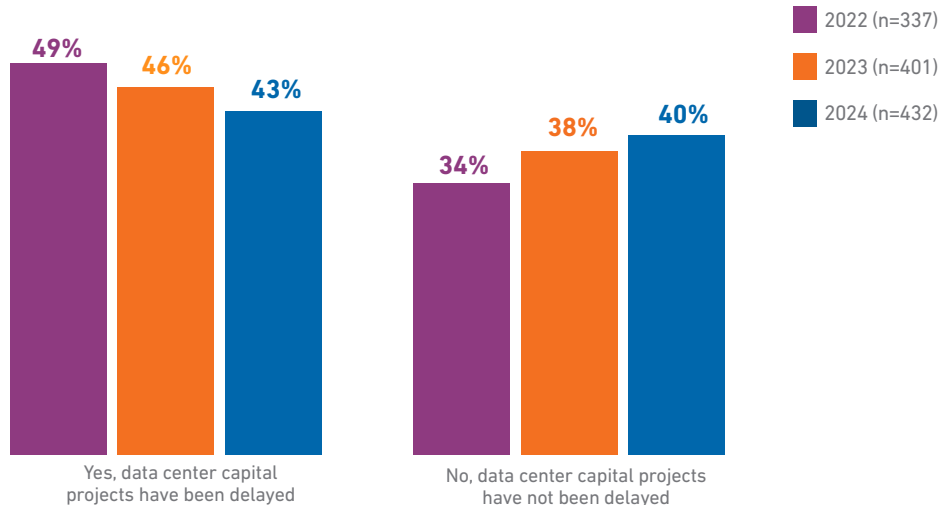

VII. Focusing on your data center capital projects, over the past 12 months have any of your organization's capital projects been delayed?

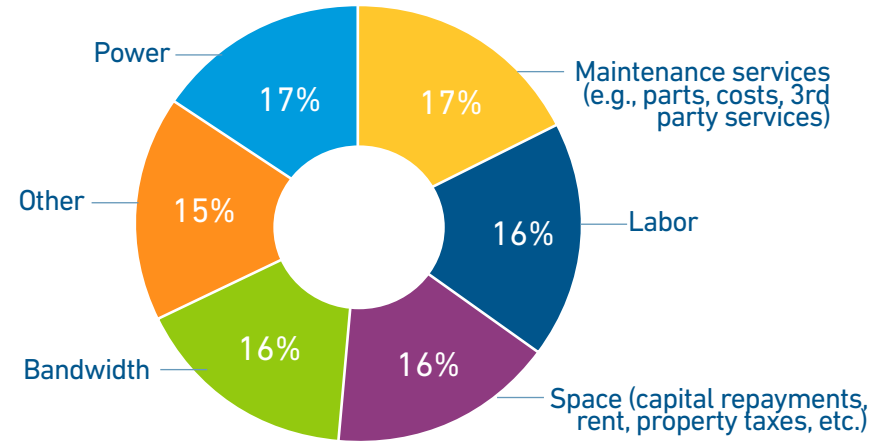

VI. Approximately what percentage of the annual costs of your largest facility are associated with each of the following areas? (n=118)

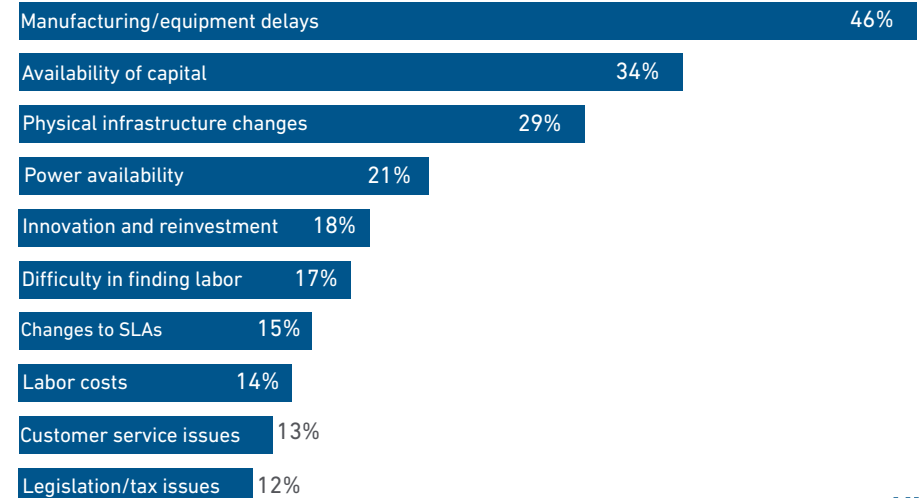

VIII. Which of these factors – if any – have been driving data center capital project delays? Choose all that apply. (n=175)

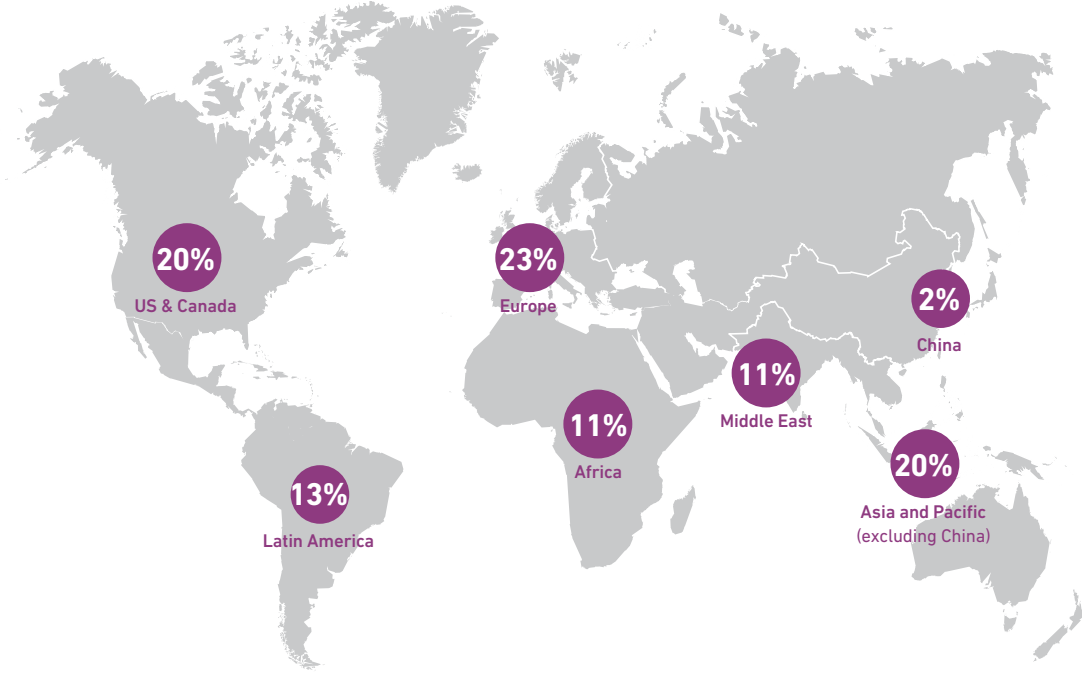

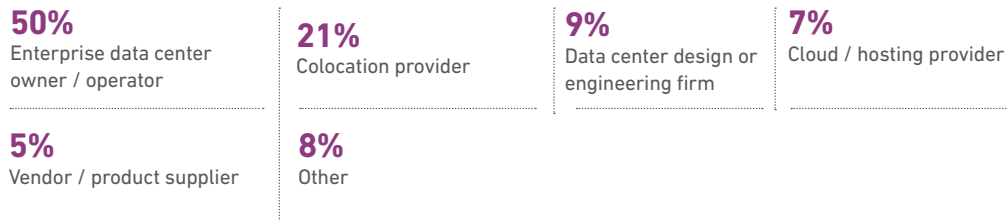


Owner/Operator Respondent Demographics

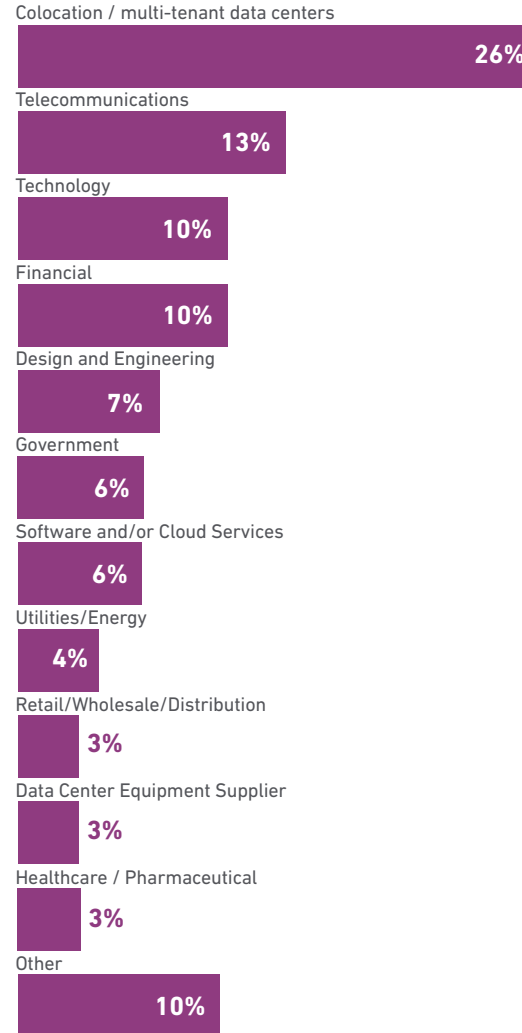
Respondents' location (n=453)
